

Guidelines for IORG Web Sites

[These guidelines must be followed in order for a site to be linked to the Supreme site.]

1. All Rainbow for Girls web pages must follow these guidelines in order for the site to be linked on the Supreme Assembly web site and on any **approved** Grand or local web site.
 - a. Approved web sites must display the **official** Rainbow for Girls emblem on the main web page (home page) indicating the site has been approved and is following the Supreme Assembly Internet Project guidelines.
 - b. Members of the Supreme Assembly Internet Project and/or Supreme Assembly Internet Committee will monitor sites at least every three months for compliance.
 - i. A non-compliant site will be reported to its Webmaster and the Supreme Deputy or Inspector of the jurisdiction.
 - ii. Supreme Inspectors and Deputies may close a site if not brought into compliance.
2. All Rainbow for Girls web sites will have an allegiance statement to Supreme Assembly on the first page (home page).
3. All Grand Assembly and Local Assembly web sites must have the approval of the Supreme Inspector or Deputy in that jurisdiction. The Supreme Inspector or Deputy may delegate authority for approval of the content of the Grand and Local Assembly Websites to the Grand Webmaster.
 - a. The Supreme Assembly Webmaster and the Supreme Inspectors and Deputies will communicate about Internet activities.
 - b. Local Assembly sites must also have approval of the Assembly's Mother Advisor and Advisory Board.
4. Postal addresses, e-mail addresses, phone numbers, or other personal information of active Rainbow girls will not be allowed. [See exception below.]
 - a. The e-mail address of a Grand Worthy Advisory may be posted with written permission of the parent(s) of the GWA.
 - b. The e-mail address or contact information of an assembly may be listed on a web page if the contact is an adult.
 - c. Grand Officers and Grand Appointments may be listed on a web page. If e-mail addresses are linked or used, the listing **must** be on a page within a web site, and have password protection. **The focus: protect the girls, their safety comes first.**
5. Pictures of individual active Rainbow girls are not allowed on web sites. [See exceptions below.]
 - a. Group pictures (i.e. Assembly or service project) will be allowed, **do NOT list girl's full names.**
 - b. Past and current Grand Worthy Advisors photos may be used. Any GWA who is under 21 must have the written permission of her parent.

6. The Supreme Assembly Webmaster will maintain a list of Grand Assembly Webmasters or other official contact person for official communications.
7. Grand Assembly Webmasters will maintain a list of local webmasters or official contact person for official communications.
8. Individual-personal web pages will not be linked to or approved by the Supreme Assembly Internet Project. There is a difference in a local assembly web site and a personal web site.
9. Open Web rings are too hard to monitor, and unless it is a closed monitored Masonic web ring it will not be used or linked.

Guidelines and recommendations are subject to change with the approval of the Supreme Assembly Internet Committee and the Supreme Executive Board. Updates will be posted to the Supreme Assembly Web site and e-mailed to Grand Assembly Webmasters. These guidelines go into effect on the anniversary date of the project, November 2, 2000.

These were submitted October 12, 2000 to the Supreme Worthy Advisor for her presentation to the Supreme Assembly Executive Board, at which Board meeting they were approved.
